Director of Music 2010 Scholarship

St Andrew's College is offering a scholarship for the position of Director of Music. This scholarship is open to both incoming and current residents (undergraduate, graduate and post graduate) in 2010. Whilst it is hoped that the Director of Music will reside at College, applicants who do not wish to reside at St Andrew's College will be considered for this scholarship.

St Andrew's has an active choral and music programme and is looking to strengthen and consolidate this aspect of College life. In 2007 a new Overs grand piano was purchased and this, along with three other pianos, is available for rehearsal and performance. There are also an organ and a virginal in College. A number of practice rooms are available.

While the successful applicants may be studying any discipline, it is expected that they will have good keyboard skills and experience directing/conducting choral groups. They will have shown leadership, excellent musical skills and a broad understanding of and skills needed to work successfully in a residential college environment. Ability to conduct and sing in the ensemble or to conduct from the keyboard would be an advantage.

The Director will be directly responsible for the St Andrew's College Choral Ensemble, will be available to rehearse regularly and will perform at chapel services held fortnightly during semester throughout the year. The Director will take an active role in the Intercollege Performing Arts Challenge and other events as needed under the direction of the Senior Fellow and Senior Tutor.

It is expected that the Director will have experience and expertise in a wide range of music from mediaeval and classical to contemporary repertoire.

The scholarship will normally be in remission of 1/2 of college fees for 1 year and will be paid in the form of fees relief on successful completion of the program at the end of each semester. It may be held in conjunction with other academic or extra curricular scholarships in 2010. If the successful applicant is non-residential remuneration will be on a fee for service basis.

Leave of absence from duties as Director must be requested in writing at least 1 week in advance to the Principal, otherwise the position may be jeopardised.

Please send expression of interest, copy of CV and academic record to Dr Hester Wilson, Senior Tutor, by 13 November, 2009. No late applications can be accepted.

Interviews will be overseen by the Senior Tutor (Dr Wilson) and Senior Fellow (Professor Jack) and will take place shortly after the closing date.
