



## St Andrew's College Principal's Prize for Prose 2019

### **PURPOSE**

The competition aims to promote expression of creative thought in written form, through the medium of prose. Entries may be in the form of a short story or creative non-fiction.

### **TOPIC**

Applicants must compose an original work on the theme of '*Still Life*'

### **PRIZE**

The winner will receive **\$1,000** to be awarded at the **Valedictory Dinner** on **Thursday 7 November 2019**.

### **PUBLICATION**

The winning entry, and selected others, will be published on the College website and in the Annual Report and Magazine.

### **JUDGES**

The competition will be judged by a panel comprising the Vice Principal, Senior Tutor and St Andrew's Student's Club cultural representative.

The panel's decision upon the award is final. NO correspondence will be entered into regarding the judges' decision.

### **CONTENT**

Submissions are limited to 3000 words of prose.

The work must be original, unpublished, and not part of a larger work. It should be based on the author's personal creative thought and not merely reproduce or summarise other material.

### **SUBMISSIONS**

Submissions must be on paper with a cover sheet containing the entrant's name. This sheet will be removed prior to judging to ensure anonymity. NO marks identifying the author may appear in the work submitted to the judges.

Entries should be typed double spaced on one side of the paper only.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

The competition is open to all current residents of St Andrew's College engaged in either undergraduate or postgraduate study. This year we are offering students the chance to take part in a writing workshop to assist them to further develop their writing skills. Applicants for the prize are welcome to use the workshop to work on their entry.

### **CLOSING DATE**

All entries must be received by **5:00pm Friday 18 October**

The winner will be notified by **Friday 1 November**
